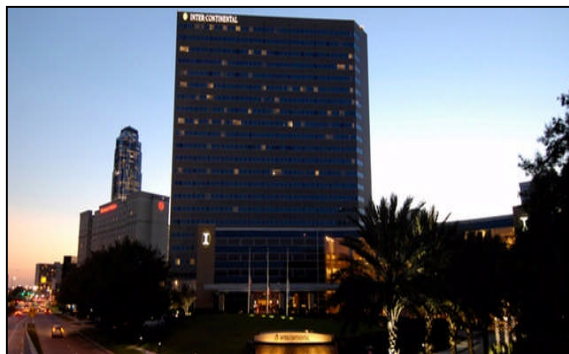


How do I register?

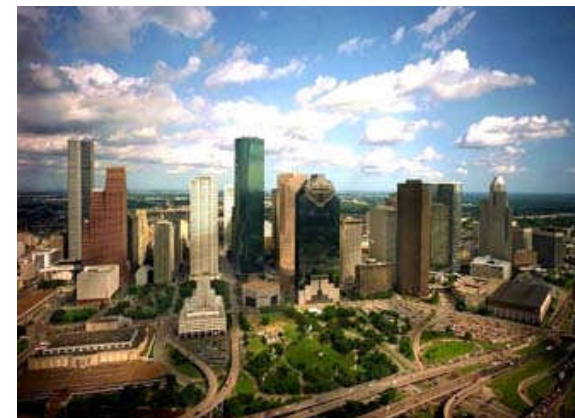
